Deportations commonly happen in Europe. People who escaped prosecution, death, discrimination or otherwise intolerable conditions, are being forced back to places they fled from and might risk death upon return. Many people resist their own deportation.

Often, commercial flights are used for deportations. It is possible that in your flight, someone is being deported: their disobedience inside the airplane can stop their deportation. And you can help.



Look around the airplane: someone might be there against their will. Many people resist their own deportation by refusing to sit down in the airplane. Pilots will never start flying if someone is not sitting down. Police often uses violence to force the person being deported to sit.

Talk to the person being deported: ask if they would like support. Talk to the other passengers: notify them of what is happening and request assistance. Speak to the flight attendants. Demand to speak to the captain. Be loud! Whatever the police is saying, only the pilot decides if the person deported can stay on board.





Stand up and refuse to sit down. Ask other passengers to do the same. Every pilot has the right to not carry out forced transportation. Demand that the person being deported is taken off the plane and make clear you will not sit down until that happens. As long you do not sit down, the plane cannot start.
